September 2017 will see Yorkshire Wolds Teacher Training take its first intake of trainees. YWTT, part of The Education Alliance, offers school-led teacher training and Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) for trainee teachers. Trainees will be placed in a wide range of school-based settings, working with outstanding practitioners throughout the Trust. During the year-long course, trainees will spend time, as a group, working with the school-led teacher training team engaging in our comprehensive ITT development sessions; covering pedagogy, practice and theory sessions. This includes a one-week induction to education programme at the beginning of the course and approximately one day a week throughout the year. All trainees will also have the chance to study towards a Post Graduate Certificate in Education. So far, 14 primary and secondary trainees have accepted places for September and the recruitment round remains open.

There is currently a planning application for a modular building to be added to the present site to provide extra teaching space for the 2017-18 intake.

The permanent site is progressing and work on the initial infrastructure is underway and the plans are starting to look very exciting.

Initial indications show that the school will be full in September 2017, if not over-subscribed, and parents will find out whether their application has been successful over the Easter holidays.

The wraparound care provision is provided on site by Building Bricks, an outstanding provider.
